a. Jeremy provided an update on COVID-END's funding status, noting that we have been invited to submit a request for a one-year extension of funding (and will find out whether we're successful on or around 29 November)

i. Kerry noted that we're silent on a role for COVID-END in terms of long-term health and socio-economic consequences of COVID-19 and that at UNICEF they see a COVID-19 focus shifting from a standalone one, to being integrated as a lens within ongoing programmes, but the long-term focus is still explicitly there
